How do I Qualify for Membership?

Junior/Senior: You must be an undergraduate student in the junior or senior class and be in the top 35% of your academic class.

Graduate/Professional School, Faculty/Staff, and Alumni: Alternatively, you may be a current graduate or professional student, faculty/staff member, or an alumnus/a at least five years past graduation to be eligible for membership.

Campus Leader: You must be a leader in one of the five phases of campus life: scholarship, athletics, service, media, or the arts.

Local Criteria: Some circles have criteria beyond the national minimum standards and may conduct interviews of prospective members.

 $O\Delta K$ is highly selective. No more than 3-5% of an institution's undergraduate enrollment may be selected for membership.
